Schools Programme

Already in 17 Primary Schools and 1 Secondary. Our flagship programme running everyday of the week. A great community investment with curriculum activities including player visits from Oldham Athletic AFC through to football activities on the pitch at Boundary Park.

Soccer Schools

11 Weeks per annum. Running dedicated Soccer Schools for children aged 6 to 12. An incredibly successful initiative mainly in Royton and Compton. A great community asset looking for naming rights sponsor.

Premier League Kicks

Oldham Athletic Community Trust is excited to announce a brand-new project to our community delivery calendar, with the Community 8s and Community 11s which began in September 2023.

The OACT Community 8s and Community 11s initiative will work alongside & complement any current grassroots commitments and aims to provide aspiring local footballers with the opportunity to participate in an additional training session, no matter what their previous playing experience or ability.

All sessions will be player-focused sessions as we look to develop children's fundamental skills to create confident players who play with freedom and creativity. Could you become the main sponsor of this?

Women's Just Play Football

A weekly session which capitalises on the rapid growth of female sport. This session allows women to participate in physical activity for free in a safe and secure environment with peers. We run this session in partnership with Active Through Football Oldham.

It's advertised as a Just Play session, but in essence is simply a football well-being session for any woman regardless of ability. Our sessions are fun, lively and welcoming and are brilliant for anyone who is interested in playing football in an environment free of judgement.

Over 30s Mens Just Play Football

The Just Play session provides a free weekly football session, aimed at men over the age of 30, with the aim of increasing social interaction and physical wellbeing.

We are conscious of the cost of living crisis that we are all experiencing and as such we wanted to remove as many barriers for people to participate as possible.

Back to the Future

We visit four venues once a week for 90 minutes. The project sees the residents using Nintendo Switches and other low level physical activities each week.

With the aim to increase physical activity across people aged 55 and over, as well as improving psychological and social wellbeing. Whilst helping tackle the social isolation amongst the elderly.

Skills Centre

In 2023, we began our delivery within Buckley Hall Prison, delivering the Twinning Project to 11 participants over a 12 week period.

The participants undertake the introduction to football qualification, and upon completion and will gain the Introduction to Football Certificate (Football Level 1), which they can use to better themselves for future aspirations and opportunities.





Community Stand
